After they both gave the OK, the food drive was set for May 31st to June 3rd. Alexandria, along with Ms. Lamont, made fliers to be sent home with each student. She gave a presentation in each classroom, announced the food drive at the weekly school assembly and gave each class 2 grocery bags to collect the food.

The outcome of the food drive "turned out really good! Each class participated resulting in 22 grocery bags, 2 XLG bags, and 1 box FULL of food! When we picked it up it completely filled our Expedition!"
